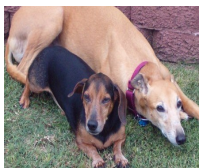

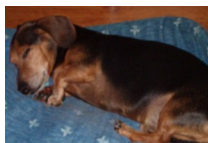

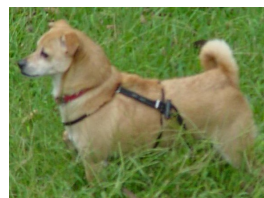


Buddy you run free with the other fur kids family waiting for you over Rainbow Bridge. Never be sick again!



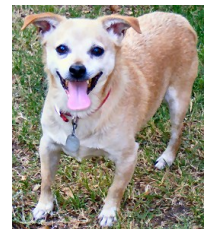

Thoughts and prayers are with you Hasel.



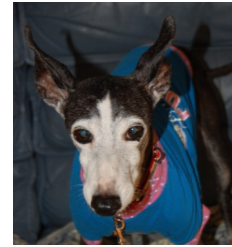
Looking for Their Forever Homes...

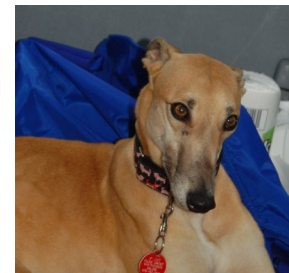
