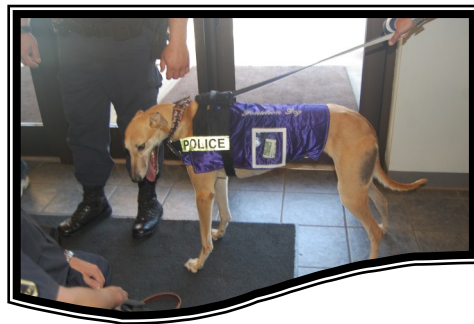
EBAY AUCTION RESULTS

Thanks for giving Logan a wonderful forever home! Run free forever little buddy. :o)



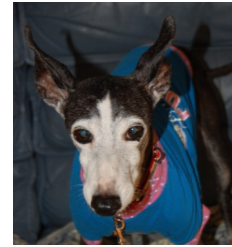
Looking for Their Forever Homes...

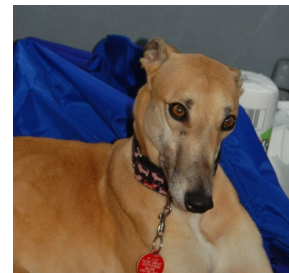

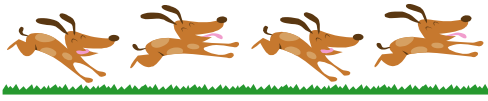
Amber: A precious brindle girl. She is so curious about everything. She is a little too curious about cats at this point. She would need to be in home without cats unless someone is willing to work with her.
